



IF YOU ARE A TRANSFER STUDENT OR HAVE PLACED OUT OF COMM-A... THEN YOU NEED CLUE!

Because most incoming freshmen are required to take a Comm-A course that includes a library module, many of your teachers are going to assume that you already know how to find books and journal articles in our campus library system.

A good way to "catch up" with what you need to know about using the library is to do "CLUE," our Computerized Library User Education tutorial.

What's in CLUE?

- CLUE is a **Web-based, multimedia tutorial** that contains five instructional modules.
- CLUE will orient you to our campus library system and the **resources and services** available to you. It also will help you learn the **skills** you will need to find books and journal articles in our libraries.
- CLUE is interactive and allows you to practice using the resources and skills covered.

How Long Does It Take to Do CLUE?

- CLUE usually takes between 40 minutes to an hour to complete. But you do NOT need to do the whole thing in one sitting. In fact, many Comm-A students tell us they learn more if they complete each module at separate times.

Where Do I Go to Use CLUE?

- CLUE works on **both Mac's and PC's**. **In order to run CLUE you will need the following:**
 - ✓ A PC running Internet Explorer 5+ or Mozilla Firefox
 - ✓ Macromedia Flash player version 6.0
 - ✓ Campus network or other high speed bandwidth such as DSL, cable modem, etc.
 - ✓ Sound turned on (speakers or headphones)
 - ✓ Printer
- You can access CLUE in any of the DoIT computer labs (InfoLabs), including the ARCH InfoLabs in the dorms. If you are having trouble running CLUE on your computer, go to any of the labs. www.doit.wisc.edu/computerlabs/labs.asp

If I Do CLUE in an InfoLab, What Do I Need to Bring With Me?

- A set of **headphones**. If you don't own headphones, you can check out a set at: College Library's Computer and Media Center, Steenbock Library's Microcomputer Lab, or the Circulation Desk on the 2nd floor of Wendt Library.
- **If you run into any problems, ask an InfoLab consultant for help.**
