## What you need

### 1. Your 11-digit UW Madison identification (ID) number

If you have a UW-Madison ID card, the ID number is the 11-digit number above the barcode on newer ID cards or the 11-digit number between the ‘b’ and ‘a’ under the barcode on older ID cards.

If you do not have an ID card, you should have received a letter from the admissions office that included a 10-digit ID number. Your 11-digit ID number is this 10-digit ID number plus one additional number at the end. In most cases, this number will be a ‘0’.

### 2. Internet access and proxy server

When accessing restricted online resources you will be directed through our proxy server. In most cases, you will be asked to enter your 11-digit ID number. Please see the DLS Web site for more information.
